The Department will not consider lump sum bids of less than \$181,775.00. This is the Department's estimated minimum valuation for the timber after a deduction of \$18,680.00 for the Department's estimated cost of construction, improvement and seeding of haul roads. Road and seeding cost estimates are not guaranteed. Bidders should do their own assessment of costs when considering their bid.

The Department reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any informalities, defects, or irregularities in the bids.

PERFORMANCE DEPOSIT:

The successful bidder must furnish as guarantee for performance of their bid commitment a corporate surety bond or a certified, cashier's or treasurer's check or official check or bank, postal or express money order payable to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. **PERSONAL CHECK OR PERSONAL MONEY ORDER WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED FOR PERFORMANCE DEPOSIT.** Negotiable securities, including letter of credit, bank savings account or bank investment certificate may be furnished in lieu of the above. CURRENCY:

All bids, bid deposits, performance deposits, sales tax and other payments related to this project will be in United States dollars only.

SALES TAX:

The Department will collect sales tax only for the timber that the buyer will consume for his own use and not sell or process for sale to others.

EXECUTION OF CONTRACT:

The successful bidder will be required to execute the Department's Tree Estimate Timber Stumpage Sale Contract. The buyer must furnish a satisfactory performance deposit by the date specified in the cover letter, which will accompany the contract when it is mailed to the buyer for execution. The contract may be examined in the forest district office.

If the highest qualified bidder fails to execute the contract or provide a satisfactory performance deposit, the bidder will be considered in default and will forfeit his bid deposit to the Department as liquidated damages and the timber will be offered to the other qualified bidders in the order of descending bids, or negotiated or re-advertised as appropriate. The consequence of such a default may also subject the bidder to further sanctions under the statewide Contractor Responsibility Program in accordance with Management Directive 215.9 Amended, as issued by the Governor's Office. Such Contractor Responsibility action may result in finding the Bidder non-responsible in subsequent timber sales and preclude an award to the Bidder in those sales.

PAYMENT FOR TIMBER DAMAGES:

The value of timber damaged by buyer will be computed as stated under Paragraph 10, entitled Timber Damage, of the Tree Estimate Timber Stumpage Sale Contract.

CUTTING BLOCK:

This sale is divided into fourteen (14) blocks. The order of cutting blocks is optional, except haul road first, which is block are optional with buyer, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the District Forester. Before logging operations may be started on any cutting block, the stumpage on that block must be paid in full. The buyer has the option to make lump sum payment for all blocks prior to the start of logging operations. Logging operations, including cleanup, must be concluded to the satisfaction of the Department on one block before logging operations may be started on another block unless modified in writing by the Department. Payment for the last cutting block to be purchased must be made by certified, cashier's or treasurer's check; or postal, bank, or express money order payable to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Certified funds may be required for other payments at the discretion of the district forester.

FELLING OF TREES:

All trees marked with yellow or red paint must be felled. All designated trees and unmarked trees 2 inches or more DBH on cutting block(s) 3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,12,13,14 must be felled, except Dogwood, Serviceberry, Yellow Poplar, Cucumber, Conifer species, blue painted (reserve) trees and trees within reserve islands., which are reserved and should not be cut. All designated trees and unmarked trees between 2 and 10 inches Dbh on cutting block(s) 11 must be felled, except Hickory, Dogwood, Serviceberry, Yellow Poplar, Cucumber, Conifer species, and blue painted trees., which are reserved and should not be cut. All sale boundary and block line trees marked with a band of blue paint at DBH and a spot of blue paint below stump height are reserved and must not be felled. Save trees marked with a spot of blue paint at DBH and below stump height must not be felled. Trees must be felled in accordance with the attached Summary of Trees to be Felled or Reserved by Cutting Block.

CULL TREES:

One hundred and twenty (120) cull trees marked with an 'X' above stump height must be felled. The buyer may utilize felled cull trees without charge.

LOGGING RESTRICTIONS:

The following are prohibited: The use of equipment that in the opinion of the District Forester results in abnormal damage to the residual stand. Tree length skidding is prohibited for the entire sale unless in the opinion of the district forester damage to the residual stand is kept at a minimum. Whole tree harvesting is prohibited for the entire sale. 1)Reserve trees are marked with a blue dot at DBH and at the stump. Reserve islands are delineated by save trees marked with two (2) blue slash marks and a blue stump mark. Trees located within the reserve islands are reserved and should not be harvested. Two reserve islands are located in the sale: one island located in block 10 and another between block 11 and 12. A copy of the E & S plan (attachment D on the contract) must be kept on site during logging and road construction operations.

TOPS AND SLASH:

No tops or slash shall be left on any transmission pipeline right-of-way, or drainage ditch leading from a culvert, water bar, intercepting dip or break in berm of road, or in, on, or within 25 feet of a State Forest boundary line, stream, spring seep, dam, lake, trail or within 100 feet of a railroad, building campsite, or officially designated park, picnic area, vista or forest monument. Tops and slash must be removed 25 feet from roads unless otherwise authorized in writing by the district forester.

Tops and slash within 100 feet of improved State Forest roads or public highways, or within the boundaries of officially designated State Parks, picnic areas, vistas, or forest monuments shall be lopped to a diameter of 3 inches and scattered evenly over the ground.

HAUL ROADS:

Buyer must improve 0.25 miles of primary haul road for this sale. Buyer must purchase, deliver and place 528 permanent tons 2A limestone. This stone will be placed on the first 0.25 miles of Quarry Road that leads into State Forest Land. This material will be hauled and tailgated on this section of road prior to the start of sale operations. Stone delivery must be coordinated in advance with State Forest Staff as they will work to spread and roll the stone when delivered. Buyer must purchase, deliver and place 264 permanent tons 2A limestone. This stone will be placed on the first 0.25 miles of Quarry Road that leads into State Forest Land. This material will be hauled and tailgated on this section of road at the completion of sale operations. Stone delivery must be coordinated in advance with State Forest Staff as they will work to spread and roll the stone when delivered. Buyer must construct 0.25 miles of secondary haul road for this sale. Buyer must Build secondary haul road "C" and landing before sale operations begin.. Buyer must purchase, deliver and spread 188 permanent cu. yds. broken bank-run shale. Shale must be placed on entire haul road and must have a running surface width of 12 feet and minimum lift of 6 inches when compacted. Buyer must grade, crown and ditch haul road. Buyer must purchase, deliver and spread 44 permanent ton #4 limestone. Limestone must be placed on the haul road where it meets Short Mtn. Road and as needed in wet areas. Limestone should be placed 12 inches thick by 12 feet wide. Buyer must Build secondary haul road "D" and landing before sale operations begin. . Buyer must purchase, deliver and spread 118 permanent cu. yds. broken bank-run shale. Shale must be placed on entire haul road and must have a running surface width of 12 feet and minimum lift of 8 inches when compacted. Buyer must grade, crown and ditch haul road. Buyer must improve 0.5 miles of secondary haul road for this sale. Buyer must Improve Secondary Haul Road "A".. Buyer must grade, crown and ditch haul road. Grade and clear already existing landing and haul road. Spread 2A stone at entry Buyer must purchase, deliver and spread 110 permanent tons 2A limestone. Limestone is to be placed where the haul road meets Short Mtn. Road Buyer must Improve Secondary Haul Road "B". Buyer must grade, crown and ditch haul road. Grade and clear already existing landing and haul road. Spread shale at end of haul road near landing entry. Buyer must purchase, deliver and spread 44 permanent cu. yds. broken bank-run shale. Buyer must Complete sale retirement: grade, crown, ditch haul roads, push off landings in preparation for seeding, and retire skid trails by removing any ruts and installing water bars where needed.. This includes all sale retirement duties. Buyer must purchase, deliver and place 30 permanent tons R8limestone. Large R8 stone large enough that cannot be moved must be placed to barricade haul road "C" and "D" at the completion of sale operations. One triaxle load placed at haul road "C" and another triaxle load placed at haul road "D".

SEEDING SALE AREAS:

Approximately 3 acres of disturbed areas must be and seeded and mulched for this sale. Before sale termination the buyer must deliver to Rothrock State Forest District Office, 181 Rothrock Lane, Huntingdon, PA 16652 the following material: 5 lbs. little bluestem seed, 2 lbs. black-eyed Susan seed, 5 lbs. deer tongue grass seed, 20 lbs. partridge pea, 100 lbs. timothy seed, 20 lbs. white clover seed, 1 lbs. Showy tick-trefoil seed, 1 lbs. Common milkweed, 4 bushels rye or oat seed, 30 lbs. Crimson clover, and 2 bushels winter wheat. Buyer must mulch newly planted seed using 75 bales straw mulch. Disturbed areas shall be prepared for seeding by grading and breaking up the soil before seeding. Buyer is not responsible to spread seed or straw but must deliver it to the Rothrock District Office or other designated location. Buyer must pay for one day rental of a straw bale mulcher for the "Rothrock State Forest" from Rick Singleton Rental - 9129 William Penn Hwy (Rt 22), Huntingdon PA, 16652;(814)643-3993 and present receipt of rental to the District Forester. All seed must be PLS(pure live seed). Seed must be purchased and delivered within 1 week of completion of sale retirement work. Receipts for all seed, straw, and straw bale mulcher must be delivered to the district office before sale termination.

SAFETY:

The Buyer, his employees and sub-contractors are required to perform all logging operations in a safe manner as required by applicable laws and regulations. The Department expects the Buyer to ensure that logging crewmembers dress in protective attire and perform their duties with equipment in accordance with standards established by the logging industry and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).

LOGGER CERTIFICATION:

On-site crew leaders for all logging crews working on this sale must be trained under the Pennsylvania Sustainable Forestry Initiative. Information relating to this training may be found on the Internet at www.sfiofpa.org. Each crew leader operating on the sale must present a valid PA SFI Core Level Training card as proof of training to the District Forester prior to beginning logging operations on the sale. Comparable training from other states may be accepted in lieu of Pennsylvania Sustainable Forestry Initiative training.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION:

The Buyer must take whatever precautions are necessary, in the opinion of the district forester, to prevent soil erosion, water pollution and any other conditions detrimental to the environment on state and private land, and must correct immediately at his/her own expense to the satisfaction of the Department any conditions detrimental to the environment which result from the operation of this sale.

SAWMILL SETS:

Sawmill sets for this sale are not permitted unless otherwise authorized in writing by the district forester.

EXTENSION OF EXPIRATION DATE OF CONTRACT:

The expiration date of this contract may be extended at the discretion of the Department. When the district forester suspends sale operation in writing for any reason other than buyer non-compliance, the contract can be extended at no cost to the buyer for a period equal to the period of suspension. If for any other reason an extension beyond the contract expiration date becomes necessary, the buyer must submit a written request 30 days prior to contract expiration date to the district forester stating the period of extension requested in months and reasons why the contract cannot be completed by the expiration date.

For each month of the requested extension period, the buyer will pay to the Department five (5) percent of the value of all cutting blocks not released by the district forester. Payment in full for each extension in the form of a certified, cashier's, treasurer's or official check, or postal or express money order payable to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania must accompany the request for extension. If the extension is granted and sale operations are completed prior to the end of the extension period, no refunds will be made.

If sale operations have not been completed by the contract expiration date and the Department has not approved a contract extension, all sales related activities will be suspended. If an extension is subsequently approved, the buyer must make payment as outlined above to include the period of suspension.

ADDITIONAL RESTRICTIONS:

- 1) Reserve trees are marked with a blue dot at DBH and at the stump. Reserve islands are delineated by save trees marked with two (2) blue slash marks and a blue stump mark. Trees located within the reserve islands are reserved and should not be harvested. Two reserve islands are located in the sale; one island located in block 10 and another between block 11 and 12.
- 2) Skidding through reserve islands is prohibited except when and where it is authorized by the District Forester.
- 3) In block 4, the designated flagged skid trail must be used to access the cutting areas and to skid logs to the landing.
- 4) Unmarked dead trees may be felled at the discretion of the operator if they are deemed a safety hazard, however, these trees remain the property of the Commonwealth and must be left on site.
- 5) Skidding is not permitted on or across state forest leased camp driveways.
- 6) Skidding is not permitted across or on the historical "conveyor line" between blocks 11 an 12 except where authorized by the District Forester
- 7) Any excavated skid trails must be returned to original contour at sale retirement. Haul Rd "D" and landing must be restored back to contour at sale retirement.
- 8) Buyer is responsible for the purchase and delivery of specified seed to the Rothrock District Office
- 9) Buyer is responsible for the purchase and delivery of specified straw to Alan Seeger Pole Barn.
- 10) Buyer is responsible for paid receipt for one (1) day rental of mulch spreading machine from Singleton Rental in Huntingdon.
- 11) Prior to sale operations beginning, buyer must purchase and deliver 4 bushels of cereal rye (or oats) to the District office.
- 12) Trees on blocks 3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,12,13, and 14 were tallied / marked using orange tree crayon.


