Sawtimber volumes are based on the Girard Form Class Volume Tables utilizing the International 1/4 Inch Log Rule. Sawtimber volume for block 1 was 100% tallied. Sawtimber volumes for blocks 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 were Variable Plot Prism Cruised. Pulpwood volume for block 1 was 10% tallied. Pulpwood volumes for blocks 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 were Variable Plot Prism Cruised.

The approved products for marking trees by prospective buyers are chalk, paint sticks and marking crayons. Prospective buyers may not use the same color of paint as the bureau in each block unless otherwise authorized in writing by the district forester.

The bids will be opened at 12:00 PM, prevailing local time, Wednesday, December 16, 2020. A certified, cashier's, treasurer's check or official check or bank, postal or express money order payable to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for \$ 10,000.00 to guarantee execution of the contract must accompany the bid. PERSONAL CHECK OR PERSONAL MONEY ORDER WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AS BID DEPOSIT. Also a bid bond on file with the Bureau of Chief Counsel is acceptable.

Bid deposits not held on file as permanent bid bonds will be handled as follows: Bid deposits will be returned to the unsuccessful bidders immediately following bid opening. The successful bidder's bid deposit will be returned when the contract is executed and a satisfactory performance deposit is furnished as required in the performance deposit section of this prospectus. The successful bidder has the option to apply his bid deposit to the performance deposit or initial payment.

The Department will not consider lump sum bids of less than \$235,624.00. This is the Department's estimated minimum valuation for the timber after a deduction of \$1,556.20 for the Department's estimated cost of construction, improvement and seeding of haulroads. Road and seeding cost estimates are not guaranteed. Bidders should do their own assessment of costs when considering their bid.

The Department reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any informalities, defects, or irregularities in the bids.

PERFORMANCE DEPOSIT:

The successful bidder must furnish as guarantee for performance of their bid commitment a corporate surety bond or a certified, cashier's or treasurer's check or official check or bank, postal or express money order payable to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. **PERSONAL CHECK OR PERSONAL MONEY ORDER WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED FOR PERFORMANCE DEPOSIT.** Negotiable securities, including letter of credit, bank savings account or bank investment certificate may be furnished in lieu of the above. CURRENCY:

All bids, bid deposits, performance deposits, sales tax and other payments related to this project will be in United States dollars only.

SALES TAX:

The Department will collect sales tax only for the timber that the buyer will consume for his own use and not sell or process for sale to others.

EXECUTION OF CONTRACT:

The successful bidder will be required to execute the Department's Tree Estimate Timber Stumpage Sale Contract. The buyer must furnish a satisfactory performance deposit by the date specified in the cover letter, which will accompany the contract when it is mailed to the buyer for execution. The contract may be examined in the forest district office.

If the highest qualified bidder fails to execute the contract or provide a satisfactory performance deposit, the bidder will be considered in default and will forfeit his bid deposit to the Department as liquidated damages and the timber will be offered to the other qualified bidders in the order of descending bids, or negotiated or re-advertised as appropriate. The consequence of such a default may also subject the bidder to further sanctions under the statewide Contractor Responsibility Program in accordance with Management Directive 215.9 Amended, as issued by the Governor's Office. Such Contractor Responsibility action may result in finding the Bidder non-responsible in subsequent timber sales and preclude an award to the Bidder in those sales.

PAYMENT FOR TIMBER DAMAGES:

The value of timber damaged by buyer will be computed as stated under Paragraph 10, entitled Timber Damage, of the Tree Estimate Timber Stumpage Sale Contract.

CUTTING BLOCK:

This sale is divided into seven (7) blocks. The order of cutting blocks is optional, except haulroad first, which is block 1. Before logging operations may be started on any cutting block, the stumpage on that block must be paid in full. The buyer has the option to make lump sum payment for all blocks prior to the start of logging operations. Logging operations, including cleanup, must be concluded to the satisfaction of the Department on one block before logging operations may be started on another block unless modified in writing by the Department. Payment for the last cutting block to be purchased must be made by certified, cashier's or treasurer's check; or postal, bank, or express money order payable to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Certified funds may be required for other payments at the discretion of the district forester.

FELLING OF TREES:

All trees marked with yellow or red paint must be felled. All designated trees and unmarked trees 2 inches or more DBH on cutting block(s) 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 & 7. All sale boundary and block line trees marked with a band of blue paint at DBH and a spot of blue paint below stump height are reserved and must not be felled. Save trees marked with a spot of blue paint at DBH and below stump

height must not be felled. Trees must be felled in accordance with the attached Summary of Trees to be Felled or Reserved by Cutting Block.

CULL TREES:

Two hundred and fifty (250) cull trees marked with an 'X' above stump height must be felled. Cull trees marked with an 'X', must be dropped and left on site where they were felled.

LOGGING RESTRICTIONS:

The following are prohibited: The use of equipment that in the opinion of the District Forester results in abnormal damage to the residual stand. Tree length skidding is prohibited for the entire sale unless in the opinion of the district forester damage to the residual stand is kept at a minimum. Whole tree harvesting is permitted with restrictions for the entire sale (See additional Restrictions). For whole tree harvesting: A copy of the E & S plan (attachment D on the contract) must be kept on site during logging and road construction operations.

TOPS AND SLASH:

No tops or slash shall be left on any transmission pipeline right-of-way, or drainage ditch leading from a culvert, water bar, intercepting dip or break in berm of road, or in, on, or within 25 feet of a State Forest boundary line, stream, spring seep, dam, lake, trail or within 100 feet of a railroad, building campsite, or officially designated park, picnic area, vista or forest monument. Tops and slash must be removed 25 feet from roads unless otherwise authorized in writing by the district forester.

Tops and slash within 100 feet of improved State Forest roads or public highways, or within the boundaries of officially designated State Parks, picnic areas, vistas, or forest monuments shall be lopped to a diameter of 3 inches and scattered evenly over the ground.

HAUL ROADS:

Buyer must grade, crown and ditch haul road as specified by the district forester. Any materials used for Haul Road improvement and/or construction must be approved prior to use and applied as directed by the district forester. All materials specified for haul road construction and maintenance except items specifically noted as temporary will become the property of the Commonwealth. Plowing of State Forest Roads is prohibited unless authorized in writing by the district forester. With the following exceptions the successful bidder may use all State Forest Roads that lead into and/or within the sale area: none.

All State Forest Roads must be kept passable at all times for use by passenger automobiles except during periods when roads are covered with ice or snow or following other extreme weather related events. The Department does not guarantee the successful bidder the use of roads maintained by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PENNDOT), townships, or other agencies or owners. Buyer must contact the PENNDOT posted highway coordinator and officials of other said roads for possible weight or other restrictions that would prevent use.

SEEDING SALE AREAS:

Approximately 2 acres of disturbed areas must be seeded for this sale. Before sale termination the buyer must deliver to District Office the following material: 60 lbs. rye seed, 100 lbs. Ernst Seed Eastern Native Habitat & CREP, and 100 bales straw mulch.

SAFETY:

The Buyer, his employees and sub-contractors are required to perform all logging operations in a safe manner as required by applicable laws and regulations. The Department expects the Buyer to ensure that logging crewmembers dress in protective attire and

perform their duties with equipment in accordance with standards established by the logging industry and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).

LOGGER CERTIFICATION:

On-site crew leaders for all logging crews working on this sale must be trained under the Pennsylvania Sustainable Forestry Initiative. Information relating to this training may be found on the Internet at www.sfiofpa.org. Each crew leader operating on the sale must present a valid PA SFI Core Level Training card as proof of training to the District Forester prior to beginning logging operations on the sale. Comparable training from other states may be accepted in lieu of Pennsylvania Sustainable Forestry Initiative training.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION:

The Buyer must take whatever precautions are necessary, in the opinion of the district forester, to prevent soil erosion, water pollution and any other conditions detrimental to the environment on state and private land, and must correct immediately at his/her own expense to the satisfaction of the Department any conditions detrimental to the environment which result from the operation of this sale.

SAWMILL SETS:

Sawmill sets for this sale are not permitted unless otherwise authorized in writing by the district forester.

EXTENSION OF EXPIRATION DATE OF CONTRACT:

The expiration date of this contract may be extended at the discretion of the Department. When the district forester suspends sale operation in writing for any reason other than buyer non-compliance, the contract can be extended at no cost to the buyer for a period equal to the period of suspension. If for any other reason an extension beyond the contract expiration date becomes necessary, the buyer must submit a written request 30 days prior to contract expiration date to the district forester stating the period of extension requested in months and reasons why the contract cannot be completed by the expiration date.

For each month of the requested extension period, the buyer will pay to the Department five (5) percent of the value of all cutting blocks not released by the district forester. Payment in full for each extension in the form of a certified, cashier's, treasurer's or official check, or postal or express money order payable to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania must accompany the request for extension. If the extension is granted and sale operations are completed prior to the end of the extension period, no refunds will be made.

If sale operations have not been completed by the contract expiration date and the Department has not approved a contract extension, all sales related activities will be suspended. If an extension is subsequently approved, the buyer must make payment as outlined above to include the period of suspension.

ADDITIONAL RESTRICTIONS:

For whole tree harvesting:

Overstory Removal Treatments (Clean Chip or processed with a delimber)

- a. Trees under 16" DBH may be whole-tree skidded but must either be cleaned chipped or processed with a delimber. Whole-tree chipping where the whole tree, including all the limbs and tops, is chipped will not be allowed.
- b. Tops and flail residue must then be carried back on site.
 - i. Operators must keep up daily with removal of tops and flail residue from landing.
 - ii. Tops and flail residue must be scattered evenly over site. (Not just around log landings or on main skid trails)
 - iii. Tops and flail residue may be spread on the main skid trail if they provide the benefit of erosion control.
 - iv. Tops and flail residue should be dropped where the operator can drag next skid through to scatter the tops and flail residue.
- c. All trees 16" DBH or greater must be limbed and topped at a minimum of 4" where they are felled. All resulting slash is reserved.
- d. Minimum of 2-5 non-merchantable logs/acre must be retained on site. This will be accomplished using the following methods.
- ** Cull trees marked with an X, must be dropped and left on site where they were felled.

Down woody debris must be retained on site


e. Permission will be granted on a block basis. Failure to follow these guidelines will require all trees to be topped where they fall.

Overstory Removal with whole-tree chipping including fine branches (Dirty or Field Chips)

- a. Trees under 12" DBH may be whole-tree skidded and chipped
- b. All trees 12" DBH or greater must be limbed and topped at a minimum of 4" where they are felled. All resulting slash is reserved. Could also increase DBH to 14", and topped at a minimum of 8' where they are felled.
- c. Minimum of 2-5 non-merchantable logs/acre must be retained on site. This will be accomplished using at least one of the following methods or a combination of the following methods.
 - i. ** Cull trees marked with an X, must be dropped and left on site where they were felled.
 - ii. Down woody debris must be retained on site
- d. Permission will be granted on a block by block basis. Failure to follow these guidelines will require all trees to be topped where they fall.

No trees will be cut nor access granted in leave islands marked with three blue slash marks.

The successful bidder on the Labradoodle Legs timber sale on Weiser State Forest will have the opportunity to purchase the Five Bucks timber sale on SGL 106 at a commensurate price.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR THE "FIVE BUCKS" TIMBER SALE

STATE GAME LANDS # 106

1) ADMINSTRATIVE ITEMS

- a) The successful bidder on the Labradoodle Legs timber sale on Weiser State Forest will have the opportunity to purchase the Five Bucks timber sale on SGL 106 at a commensurate price.
- b) There will not be a pre bid tour. Contact Curtis Noll 610-413-1706 if you have any questions.
- c) The timber sale will be accessed using Weiser State Forest road network.
- d) It is further understood that an acceptable bond of **\$7,000.00** will be provided to guarantee faithful performance of the agreement
- e) For this timber harvest, all pulpwood trees may be felled, skidded and chipped in their entirety. A pulpwood tree is defined as follows: that is any tree between 1" DBH and 12" DBH and which does not contain a merchantable saw log.
- f) The Regional Forester or his designee will closely monitor harvest and skidder damage to residual trees. If damage becomes excessive additional restrictions will be placed on the harvest. Total disregard to the residual trees and failure to take corrective actions will result in payment of damages and/or termination of the timber contract.
- g) If site conditions in the woods (for felling, skidding or trucking) or the use of the haul road become too wet, muddy or ice covered and could or will cause damage to the property, all phases of the job will be suspended until working conditions are favorable. The Regional Forester will make the final decision in this matter.

2) BOUNDARIES, BLOCKS AND CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

- a) All sale activity (Felling, Skidding & Trucking) is restricted to the defined sale area. Sale area boundary is defined by blue paint.
- b) No skidding is permitted on the haul road.
- c) In all blocks: All Red and Blue painted trees must be left standing and not damaged. All unmarked trees 1" in diameter and larger in these blocks must be cut through and placed on the ground.
- d) All stumps must be less than 12" in height when measured from the ground.
- e) All tree tops left on site must be lopped down to a maximum height of 6'.

3) US/STATE/LOCAL ROADS

a) Weiser State Forest road network off of RT 61.

4) GAME LAND ROADS TO BUILD / IMPROVE

a) The timber contractor must improve an existing haul road at this location for a total distance of 7,000 feet. The road must have a 12-foot running surface along with a crown and side ditches. Water bars, intercept dips, and water turnouts will be used for draining surface water. Stone will be required on portions of road. All stone locations will have the material tailgate spread to a depth of 2 inches. The Regional forester will designate specific locations for stone, culvert pipes and water bars. The side ditches and all disturbed areas must be seeded immediately following

construction of the road.

- b) Required Clean Limestone for this harvest
 - 1. Stone is for all designated locations on the haul road.
 - 2. Minimum of 425 tons of <u>AASHTO # 3</u> (similar to 3A modified) stone is required. 50 tons for pre-sale preparation, 100 tons for in sale repairs and 275 tons for sale retirement.
 - 3. Minimum of 150 tons of AASHTO #1 stone is required before the timber sale can begin.
 - 4. Receipts may be required to verify the amount of stone applied to the designated locations.
- c) Haul Road Construction / Timeframe
 - The Regional Forester will designate all locations for water bars, culvert pipes, stone and intercept dips. Side
 ditches and disturbed areas must be seeded immediately following grading of the haul road. All road
 improvements must be completed and approved by the Regional Forester.
 - 2. The timber contractor will supply and install one smooth bore 15" X 20' black plastic culvert pipe. The pipe must be installed with a backhoe and be covered with a minimum of 15" of AASHTO # 3 stone. Stone head walls must be set on each end of each pipe. The pipe must have side ditches for the drainage of water to the pipe and a tailrace for drainage out of the pipe.
 - 3. All road improvements must be allowed to settle for 30 days prior to any usage. During that time period no truck activity will be permitted on the newly graded or constructed road. This requirement will be waived if the operator provides a vibrating roller to compact the entire road surface. The road must have a solid surface and not show any movement. The use of the roller is at the discretion of the contractor.
 - 4. Construction and or improvement of the haul road should occur during the time period of April 1 to October 10. During times of wet site conditions no road construction will be permitted.
 - 5. Between October 10 and April 1 road construction and road improvements will be permitted providing the following conditions can be met.
 - a. The site conditions must be favorable for the construction of a quality road (Not wet or frozen ground).
 Excavation and grading of the haul road along with installation of culvert pipe must be able to be completed without creating an erosion hazard.
 - b. Seeding will occur at the completion of the construction. Straw mulch must be applied to all locations, which would require seeding. (Applies to this Time Period).
 - c. The ground must be workable and able to be compacted. Access for stone trucks must adequate. Designated log landing locations must be cleared.
 - The Regional Forester will have the final decision to approve construction/improvement of the haul road and landing.
 - 6. The condition of the haul road on Weiser State Forest from the eastern most State Forest log landing to the PGC boundary must be approved by the Bureau of Forestry representative and PGC before sale retirement.
 - 7. All equipment will be cleaned of soil and debris before being moved onto site to prevent spread of invasive species.
 - 8. The road will be inspected and approved by the Regional Forester prior to any usage by the timber operator.

5) LANDINGS

- a) Three locations have been designated as the log landings for this harvest. The landings are located in blocks 1, 3, and 6. At each location the contractor will be required to build a log landing. The log landings will require the excavation of stumps and rocks as well as the grading and leveling of the site. The contractor will be permitted to load trucks on the haul road providing there is a clear path for other Game Land users to safely utilize the road.
- b) Total size of each landing will be less than ½ acre in size.
- Upon completion of the harvest operation, each landing must be cleared of all logging debris/slash and then graded, limed, fertilized, seeded, and mulched.

6) SKIDDING

- a) No skidding outside of the designated sale area.
- b) Skidding is permitted on the existing firebreak trail. Sections of the firebreak trail inside or near the timber sale must be cleared of debris at the conclusion of logging and any sections used for skidding must be regraded with water bars installed.
- c) Skidding of material onto the landings may require the crossing of the haul road at one location. Damage to the road surface will be repaired immediately following the completion of the harvest in the blocks. Crossing sites must be approved by the regional forester.
- d) Skidding is not permitted through reserve sale areas or islands.
- e) All material to be removed from all sale blocks must be skidded to the landings.
- f) If a skid trail will be sitting idle for one month or more they must have open and functional water bars.
- g) All skid trails will require the grading of wheel ruts, the installation of water bars and seeding at the conclusion of the harvest operation.

7) SEEDING OF ROADWAYS AND LANDINGS

- a) The entire haul road from the eastern most State Forest log landing to the last PGC log landing will require grading at the completion of the harvest. Final grading and ditches must be established with bull dozer with a six way blade or equivalent piece of equipment. Use of a log skidder or similar type of equipment is not acceptable for grading the road. Failure to use the proper equipment will require a second grading of the road. Approximately 3,200 feet of road will be top dressed with stone and the remainder (about 4,000 feet of road) will be seeded.
- b) Seeding of disturbed sections of the haul road will be required as designated by the Regional Forester.
- c) Seeding Specifications:

TRAILS AND ROAD

4 lbs. New Zealand White Clover/acre

4 lbs. Red Clover/Acre

3 lbs. Birdsfoot Tree Foil/Acre

60 lbs. Wheat/acre - fall

60 lbs Oats/acre - spring

Fertilizer: 400 lbs of 10-10-10/acre

Ground Limestone: 2 tons of lime/acre (Lime must contain 1.4% Mg)

Straw Mulch: 100 bales per acre of clean wheat straw

Straw Mulch is for the seeding of the Log Landings and designated portion of the haul road. Straw must spread to a depth of less than ½" over the entire seeded location. Clean wheat straw must be used as mulch. No hay or other grass mulch will be permitted. Use of mechanized spreader for straw mulch is required.

Approximately 2.6 acres are expected to be seeded at the conclusion of the harvest. The breakdown is as follows:

Log landings 1.5 acres Skid Trails 0.1 acre Haul Road 1.0 acres

Spring Seeding: April 1 to May 30

Fall Seeding: September 1 to October 10

A vegetative cover on all seeded sites will be acceptable when 70 percent of the site has the desired cover. The performance bond will not be released until this requirement is satisfied.

d) Sale Block Clean-up

- 1. All cleanup work in a sale block must be completed before the contractor will be permitted to move into the next cutting block.
- 2. All skid trails must be leveled and water bars installed where needed or when directed by the Regional Forester
- 3. All skid trails must be seeded immediately (spring & fall seeding period) following the completion of its usage.
- 4. Each log landing must be graded, sawdust and logging debris scattered along with bare mineral soil exposed, and ground lime, fertilizer, seed and straw mulch applied. Seeding of these sites is only permitted during the designated seeding periods.
- 5. The contractor must notify the Regional Forester prior to the application of lime, fertilizer, seed and mulch.

8. OPERATIONS AND NON-WORK DAYS

- a) No in woods operations will be permitted on the following days for the period of this contract:
 - 1. All Saturdays in the months of October, November, December and January.
 - 2. The opening day and all Saturdays during spring gobbler season, including the youth spring gobbler hunt.
 - 3. The four days of the general statewide bear season.
 - 4. The entire two weeks of the general firearms deer season.
 - 5. The opening day of the flintlock muzzleloader season.
- b) The timber operator, employees and sub-contractors may not hunt to, from, or at the job site when the work location is beyond a gated road that is closed to public travel. The contractor may travel to and from the work location on <u>no-work</u> days to check on the condition of equipment. **No felling, skidding, trucking, equipment repair or access for the purpose of hunting at the job site will be permitted.**
- c) Except on Sundays, it is unlawful to be present on State Game Lands from November 15 through December 15 inclusive when not engaged in lawful hunting or trapping and fail to wear a minimum of 250 square inches of daylight fluorescent-orange material on the head, chest and back combined, or in lieu thereof, a hat of the same colored material. The material shall be worn so it is visible in a 360-degree arc.

9. SAFETY AND LOGGER TRAINING

- a) The buyer, his employees and sub-contractors are expected to perform all logging operations in a safe manner as required by applicable laws and regulations. The Commission expects the Buyer to ensure that logging crewmembers dress in protective attire, and perform their duties with equipment, in accordance with standards established by the logging industry and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).
- b) The PGC recommends that logging crews working on State Game Lands be trained in safe logging techniques and sound environmental logging practices through a formal training program such as the one provided by the Pennsylvania Sustainable Forestry Initiative or another similar course.

10. MISCELLANEOUS

- a) The timber contractor must comply with erosion and sedimentation control plan for the harvest site. The plan must be on site and available for inspection at all times.
- b) The timber operator should review the plan, due to his responsibility for the implementation of erosion controls during the harvest operation.
- c) Vehicle traffic on the PGC access road shall not exceed 25 MPH.
- d) The selling of firewood to the general public will not be permitted. The sale of firewood to a commercial firewood contractor is permitted.
- e) Payment for block 4 of the sale is required at the time of execution of the timber contract. Failure to provide this payment will void the timber contract.
- f) Payment for at least three blocks is due by October 31, 2021.
- g) This timber contract will expire on October 31, 2022.
- h) Final payment is due no later than 120 days before the expiration of the agreement.
- i) This timber sale falls in the spotted lanternfly quarantine area. The buyer is responsible for understanding and complying with all applicable requirements. Up to date information can be found at www.pda.state.pa.us/spottedlanternfly.
