Hunter Run Cross-Country Ski Trail

This area contains several miles of maintained trails designed for low-density recreation. The cross-country ski trails are marked with blue painted rectangles.

Cornplanter State Forest provides a unique opportunity for dispersed low-density recreation. A goal of the Bureau of Forestry is to minimize conflicts among state forest users, and to ensure that natural resources will be managed in an environmentally sound manner—now and into the future.

Winter enthusiasts come to Cornplanter State Forest to hike, cross-country ski, and snowshoe. The Hunter Run Ski Trail was designed as a nested loop system where recreationists can either choose to follow small loops or larger loops depending on their abilities and interests. All of the trails are rated as easy to more difficult. The McCaferty Run Trail is not suitable for cross-country skiing due to a steep grade and an elevated walkway at the base of the hill.



Cornplanter State Forest

Cornplanter State Forest, located in Forest, Crawford and Warren Counties is a valuable part of Pennsylvania's 17 million acres of forestland. It is named in honor of Chief Cornplanter, a famous Native American Chief of the Seneca Tribe.

Complanter State Forest contains about 1,585 acres. All state forests provide clean water, recreation, habitat for plants and animals, places to enjoy tranquility, and high-value timber.



Winter Trail Etiquette

- Do not walk on ski trails or permit pets to walk on trails.
- Be tolerant and respectful of other winter recreationsists.
- Yield to faster skiers.
- Motorized vehicles are prohibited on the cross-country ski trail.
- Do not litter!
