SJC Tract

The SJC Tract totals about 376 acres of forested land and is located on Snow Hill Road in Price Township, Monroe County. This tract is characterized by a mixed-oak forest and hemlock lowlands. Numerous shared-use trails wind their way around this tract and offer great opportunities for hikers and mountain bikers alike. Stony Run, a tributary to Brodhead Creek, flows through the southern end of this tract and supports a natural reproducing population of trout.



Care for the Land

State forests belong to all Pennsylvanians. Take time to enjoy them, but know the rules and regulations designed to protect the forests and you. Please be careful with fire, keep our forests litter free and don't damage trees and other plants.

Dual Certified Forest

Pennsylvania's 2.2-million-acre state forest system is one of the largest dual certified forests in North America. The forest is certified under Forest Stewardship CouncilTM and Sustainable Forestry Initiative[®] standards. The FSC[®] is an independent organization supporting environmentally appropriate, socially beneficial, and economically viable management of the world's forests. SFI[®] certification focuses on protection of water quality, biodiversity, wildlife habitat, species at risk, and forests with exceptional conservation value. Dual certification ensures that Pennsylvania's state forests are managed to the highest third-party standards.


