Area Facts



- Total area is 4,992 acres.
- Found south of the town of Cammal, Lycoming Co.
- Area is named after Miller Run, a High-Quality (DEP) stream in the natural area.
- Numerous, unmaintained hiking-only trails cross the natural area, including Sam Carson, Green, Solomon Run, Shanty Point, and McClure Run trails.

Ecosystem/Terrain

- Dominant, mature mixed-oak forest is second growth.
- Valleys are interspersed with northern hardwoods and conifers.
- Terrain is rugged and steep, with high ridgetops up to 2100 feet.



White oaks are a favored food source of a variety of wildlife in the natural area.

Wildlife

- The natural area and surrounding forest are known for their diversity of songbirds.
- Examples include many species of warblers.



Cerulean warblers prefer mature oak forests and can be found in the natural area.

- The natural area harbors top predators like black bears, coyotes, and timber rattlesnakes.



Hikers beware. Timber rattlesnakes are found in the natural area.

Access

- Sinking Springs and Browns Run roads access the natural area from the south.
- Lebo Road accesses the natural area to the north, dead ending at the Lebo Vista, which overlooks the natural area and the Pine Creek Valley.
- The Sinking Springs Spur off Sinking Springs Road also dead ends at a vista, this one looking north.
- Routes 414 and 44 are major corridors in the area.



Miller Run is a Class A Wild Trout Water (PFBC) found in the natural area.
