Scenic Slate Run

- Total area is 4,177 acres.
- ➤ Area is part of the 146,539acre Tiadaghton State Forest.
- Found north of the town of Slate Run.
- Area contains numerous tributaries within the Pine Creek watershed.
- ➤ The renowned Black Forest Trail, a featured state forest hiking trail, spans the wild area from north to south.

Ecosystem/Terrain

- Dominant, mature mixedoak forest is second growth.
- ➤ Valleys are interspersed with northern hardwoods and conifers.
- Terrain is rugged and steep, with a large plateau in the center of the area.



Oaks are common and provide food for wildlife in the wild area.

Wildlife

- The wild area and surrounding forest are known for their diversity of songbirds.
- Examples include many species of warblers.



Cerulean warblers prefer mature oak forests and can be found in the wild area.

The wild area harbors top predators like black bears, coyotes, and timber rattlesnakes.



Hikers beware. Timber rattlesnakes are found in the wild area.

Access

- Route 414 accesses the wild area to the east.
- Gamble Run Road borders the wild area to the northeast.
- ➤ Slate Run Road borders the wild area to the west.
- Several miles of the Black Forest Trail wind through the wild area.
- The hiking only Algerine Trail traverses the northeastern portion of the wild area.
- ➤ Parking can be found at the end of Algerine Lane and along Slate Run Road. (see map on reverse)



Slate Run and Gamble Run are High Quality Coldwater Fisheries found in the wild area.
