MOUNT JEWETT TO KINZUA BRIDGE TRAIL

7.8 MILES OF THE KNOX & KANE RAIL TRAIL

The Mount Jewett to Kinzua Bridge Trail is an 8-mile section of the 74-mile Knox & Kane Rail Trail managed by the Mount Jewett to Kinzua Bridge (MJ2KB) Trail Club. The history of the trail begins when Headwaters Charitable Trust (HWCT) originally purchased the Knox & Kane rail corridor from the Kovalchick Corp. of Indiana, Pennsylvania, with the vision of turning it into a rail trail for recreation and tourism.

The MJ2KB Trail Club was formed in 2016 with a mission to build or maintain the trail from the Kinzua Bridge State Park to Lantz Corners, a total of nearly 8 miles. By utilizing state and other sources of grant funding, donated equipment, and volunteer labor by members, the MJ2KB Trail Club has made many trail improvements in its history including, the installation of wooden decking and railings on three railroad trestles and surfacing the trail between Mount Jewett and Lantz Corners. The club has also added amenities, including the construction of an additional parking area, five pavilions with picnic tables, installation of interpretive signage, and multiple benches along the trail.
